About the Manuals


The following manuals are included with the player. Additionally, after installing software from the supplied CD-ROM, you can refer to the help provided within each software.

- Quick Start Guide explains set up and the basic operations, enabling you to import songs, videos and photos to a computer, to transfer them to the player, and to play them back.
- Precautions explains important notes to prevent accidents.
- Troubleshooting explains symptoms, causes and remedies when the player has problems.
- This Operation Guide explains standard and advanced features, enabling you to make full use of the player and troubleshoot problems.

Browsing the Operation Guide

To use the buttons in the Operation Guide

Click the buttons located in the upper right of this manual to jump to "Table of Contents," "Home Menu List," or "Index."



Jumps to the table of contents Find what you are looking for from a list of topics in the manual.

Jumps to the home menu list Find what you are looking for from a list of the option items in the player's menu.

Jumps to the index Find what you are looking for from a list of key words mentioned in the manual.

ີ່ 🖞 Hints

- You can jump to the indicated page by clicking a page number in the table of contents, in the Home menu list, or in the index.
- You can jump to the indicated page by clicking a page reference indication (e.g. @ page 4) on each page.
- To search for a reference page by keyword, click the "Edit" menu, select the "Search" feature of the Adobe Reader to display the navigation frame, type the keyword into the Search text box, and click "Search."
- Once you jump to another page, you can jump to the previous or next page by clicking the or button located at bottom of the Adobe Reader screen.
- Operation procedure may differ, depending on your Adobe Reader version.

To change the page layout

The buttons at the bottom of the Adobe Reader screen enable you to select how pages are displayed.



Single Page

Pages are displayed one at a time. When you scroll, the display changes to a previous or succeeding page.

📃 Continuous

Pages are displayed as a continuous roll of pages.

When you scroll, the previous or next pages scroll up or down continuously.

🗒 Continuous - Facing

Two pages are displayed side by side with each pair part of a continuous roll of pages. When you scroll, the previous or next pairs of pages scroll up or down continuously.

Facing

Two pages are displayed side by side. When you scroll, the display changes to previous or succeeding pairs of pages.

How to install the earbuds correctly

If the earbuds do not fit your ears correctly, low bass sound may not be heard. To enjoy better sound quality, change the size of the earbuds or

adjust the earbud position to sit on your ears comfortably and fit your ears snugly.



At purchase, M size earbuds are installed. If the earbuds do not fit your ears, try one of the other supplied sizes, S or L.


When you change the earbuds, make sure to install the earbuds with the headphones properly to prevent accidentally leaving the earbuds inside your ears.

Parts and Controls





1 5-way button^{*1}

Starts playback and enables navigation of the player's on-screen menus (@ page 12).

2 BACK/HOME button*2

Press to go up one list screen level, or to return to the previous menu. Press and hold the BACK/HOME button to display the Home menu (@ page 11).


3 WM-PORT jack

Use this jack to connect the supplied USB cable, or optional peripheral devices, such as supported accessories for the WM-PORT.

4 Headphone jack

For connecting the headphones or the headphone extension cord. Insert the jack pin until it clicks into place. If the headphones are connected improperly, the sound from the headphones may not sound right.

5 Display

The display may vary, depending on functions (**P** page 11).

Displays the option menu (@ page 17).

If you press and hold the OPTION/ PWR OFF button, the screen turns off and the player enters the standby mode. If you press any button while the player is in the standby mode, the "Now Playing" screen, etc., appears and the player is ready for operation. Furthermore, if you leave the player in the standby mode for about a day, the player turns completely off automatically. If you press any button when the player is turned off, the start up screen appears first, then the "Now Playing" screen appears.

Note

• The player consumes battery power very slightly even when it is in the standby mode. Therefore, the player might turn completely off in a short time, depending on the power remaining in the battery.

7 VOL $+^{1}$ – button

Adjusts the volume.

8 **RESET button**

Resets the player when you press the RESET button with a small pin, etc. (@ page 93).

9 Strap hole

This is used to attach a strap (sold separately).


10 HOLD switch

You can protect the player against accidental operation by using the HOLD switch when carrying it. By sliding the HOLD switch in the direction of the arrow, all operation buttons are disabled. If you slide the HOLD switch to the opposite position, the HOLD function is released.

- *¹There are tactile dots. Use them to help with button operations.

Player Controls and Screens

Use the 5-way button and the BACK/HOME button to navigate through screens, play songs, videos, photos, and change the player's settings. The Home menu appears when you press and hold the BACK/HOME button. The diagram below shows how the screen changes when you press various operation buttons. For example, the player's screen changes as shown below when you select "Music Library"– "Album" from the Home menu.



How to use the 5-way button and screen

The 5-way button performs different functions on the list screens, on the thumbnail screens, and on the "Now Playing" screen.

Buttons	Description

Δ / ∇	Press the Δ/∇ button to find the beginning of the next, previous or the currently playing video. ^{*2}	
⊲/⊳	Press the ⊲/▷ button to scan a playing video backwards or forwards quickly During playback, fast forwards/backwards changes through 3 levels by repeatedly pressing the ⊲/▷ button ((×10), (×30), (×100)). By pressin and holding, speed increases 1 level, and by releasing, returns to the normal playback.



* When playing songs while a slide show is paused, the screen goes dark if there is no operation for the period set in "Screensaver Timing" (@ page 70). When the song playback and a slide show accompanying it are paused, and there is no operation for more than 30 seconds, the screen turns off and the player enters the standby mode.



Displaying the "Now Playing" Screen

The "Now Playing" screen displays information about the currently playing contents.



Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the Home menu appears.

Press the △/▽/◁/▷ button to select ▷ (Now Playing), and then press the ▷ II button to confirm.

Detailed information about the currently playing content file appears.



- You can display the "Now Playing" screen by pressing the OPTION/PWR OFF button to select "Now Playing."
- When playing videos or photos, you can select "Go to the song playback screen" from the option menu to display the song playback screen.

Using the OPTION Button

You can change various settings of each function when you press the OPTION/ PWR OFF button. The OPTION/PWR OFF button is useful since you can display the setting screen immediately without selecting setting items from the (Settings) menu of the Home menu.





1 Press the OPTION/PWR OFF button while playing or pausing songs, videos or photos.

The option menu appears.

Press the △/▽/ ▷ button to select the item, and then press the ▷III button to confirm.

The screen of the selected setting item appears or the selected command is performed.

The items of the option menu differ, depending on the screen on which you press the OPTION/PWR OFF button. For details, see "Displaying the Music Option Menu" (page 31), "Displaying the Video Option Menu" (page 56), "Displaying the Photo Option Menu" (page 66).


Searching for Songs (Music Library)

Music Library

Songs transferred by Windows Explorer, or another transfer capable software can be played back on the player.

You can search for songs by title of songs, albums, artist, and genre, etc.

• To delete songs from the player, use the software you used to transfer the songs, or Windows Explorer.

Searching for songs by song name

- Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the Home menu appears.
- Press the △/▽/
 ▷ button to select
 (Music Library), and then press the ▷III button to confirm.

The list screen appears.

Our Select "All Songs," and then press the ▷ button to confirm.

The song list appears.

Press the △/▽/⊲/▷ button to select a song, and then press the ▷II button to confirm.

The song you selected starts to play back and the playback of songs continues in order.

Searching for songs by album



Press the △/▽/◁/▷ button to select ↓ (Music Library), and then press the ▷^{III} button to confirm.

The list screen appears.

3 Press the △/▽/⊲/▷ button to select "Album," and then press the ▷□ button to confirm.

The album list appears.

Press the △/▽/ button to select an album, and then press the ▷III button to confirm.

The song list for the selected album appears.

Solution to select a song, and then press the ▷II button to confirm.

The song you selected starts to play back and the playback of songs continues in order.

Searching for songs by artist Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the Home menu appears. **2** Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle / \rangle$ button to select \int (Music Library), and then press the \triangleright III button to confirm. The list screen appears. 3 Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle/\rangle$ button to select "Artist," and then press the \triangleright button to confirm. The artist list appears. 4 Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\Box/\triangleright$ button to select an artist, and then press the \triangleright button to confirm. The album list for the selected artist appears. **5** Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle \rangle$ button to select an album, and then press the \triangleright III button to confirm. The song list for the selected album appears. **6** Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle \rangle$ button to select a song, and then press the \triangleright button to confirm.

The song you selected starts to play back and the playback of songs continues in order.

Searching for songs by genre Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the Home menu appears. **2** Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle/\rangle$ button to select $\sqrt{2}$ (Music Library), and then press the \triangleright II button to confirm. The list screen appears. 3 Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle / \rangle$ button to select "Genre," and then press the \triangleright button to confirm. The genre list appears. 4 Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle / \rangle$ button to select a genre, and then press the \triangleright button to confirm. The artist list for the selected genre appears. **5** Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle/\rangle$ button to select an artist, and then press the \triangleright button to confirm. The album list for the selected artist appears. \triangleright button to confirm. The song list for the selected album appears. 7 Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\Box/\triangleright$ button to select a song, and then press the \triangleright button to confirm. The song you selected starts to play back and the playback of songs continues in order.

The list of release years appears. 4 Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle \rangle$ button to select a year, and then press the \triangleright button to confirm. The artist list for the selected release year appears. **5** Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle/\rangle$ button to select an artist, and then press the \triangleright button to confirm. The song list for the artist, selected from the release year, appears. **6** Press the $\Delta/\nabla/\langle \rangle$ button to select a song, and then press the \triangleright button to confirm.

The song you selected starts to play back and the playback of songs continues in order.

- You can play all songs of a list item by selecting the item from the list and pressing and holding the ▷𝔅 button in steps 4 to 5.
- You can select the playback range of songs (@ page 34).

Searching for songs by folder

When you transfer data to the "MUSIC" folder by dragging and dropping in Windows Explorer, up to the 8th level under the "MUSIC" folder will appear and can be played back. Even if you use another transfer capable software for transferring songs, you can still search for songs by folder.

Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the Home menu appears.

Press the △/▽/◁/▷ button to select ↓ (Music Library), and then press the ▷III button to confirm.

The list screen appears.

3 Press the △/▽/◁/▷ button to select "Folder," and then press the ▷□ button to confirm.

The folder list or the song appears.

Press the △/▽/◁/▷ button to select a folder or song, and then press the ▷□ button to confirm.

When you select a folder in step ③, the song or folder list(s) appear. When you select a song in step ③, the playback screen appears, then the song playback starts. Repeat step ④ if necessary until the desired song appears. The song you selected starts to play back and the playback of songs continues in order.


• You can select the playback range of songs (@ page 34).

Notes

- Up to 8 folder levels can be recognized.
- You cannot play all songs of a folder even if you select a folder from the list and press and hold the ▷□ button in step ④.

Searching for Songs by Initial Letter

You can search for songs by the initial letter of the artist name, album title, or song name.



Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the Home menu appears.

Press the △/▽/ button to select @ (Initial Search), and then press the ▷^{III} button to confirm.

The list of categories you can search by appears.

"Artist" searches by the artist name, "Album" searches by the album title, and "Song" searches by the song name.

Our Select a Category, and then press the ▷ button to confirm.

A screen appears that enables you to select a character.

Press the △/▽/ ▷/♡/ button to select an initial character, and then press the ▷□ button to confirm.


When the search finishes, the results are displayed.

When you select "Artist" or "Album," you can narrow the search results and select a specific song.

When "Artist" or "Album" is selected and you press and hold the $\succ II$ button, all songs on the item are played.

Playing a Playlist

You can play lists of songs (playlists). Also, you can create playlists using the supplied Windows Media Player 11, or another transfer capable software for creating playlists. However, some playlists may not be recognized by the player, depending on software. For details on operation, refer to Help of the software or ask its manufacturer.



Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the Home menu appears.

Press the △/▽/◁/▷ button to select (Playlists), and then press the ▷III button to confirm.

The list of playlists appears.

Our Select a playlist, and then press the ▷ button to confirm.

The song list appears.


Press the △/▽/</>

button to select a song, and then press the ▷II button to confirm.

The song you selected starts to play back and the playback of songs continues in order.

Searching for Songs Based on the Currently Playing Song

You can search for other songs, albums, and artists by the song information of the currently playing song.



 Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the Home menu appears.

Press the △/▽/⊲/▷ button to select ▷ (Now Playing), and then press the ▷^{III} button to confirm.

The "Now Playing" screen of the currently playing song appears.

Our Section 1 Press the and button to display a cursor and select an item in which you want to search for songs, and then press the button to confirm.

The following lists appear, depending on the item you selected.

- Artist: The album list of the currently playing artist.
- Album: The song list of the currently playing album.
- Genre: An artist list in the same genre as the currently playing artist.
- Release Year: An artist list from the same release year as the currently playing song.

ີ່ 🖞 Hints


- You can display the detailed information about the song, such as playing time, audio format, bit rate*, and file name from the "Now Playing" screen. Press the OPTION/PWR OFF button to select "Detailed Information" on the "Now Playing" screen.
 - * If the song has a variable bit rate, "VBR" is shown for the bit rate.
- You can display the cover art from the "Now Playing" screen. Press the OPTION/PWR OFF button to select "Cover Art" on the "Now Playing" screen.

Notes

- When playing songs recorded using variable bit rate (VBR) recording, a progress bar that shows the elapsed playback time, and the time itself is displayed, however, this time data is not stable, which may result in incorrect information being displayed.
- If no cover art has been registered, a preinstalled image in the player appears. Some cover art is not displayed, depending on its file format.

Playing Songs in Random Order (Intelligent Shuffle)

The player offers 2 different random modes (also known as shuffle play).



Playing songs released in the same year in random order (Time Machine Shuffle)



Recharging the Player

The player's battery is recharged while the player is connected to a running computer.

When you connect the player to your computer, use the supplied USB cable. When the remaining battery indication of the display shows: Imm, charging is completed (charging time is approx. 3 hours).

When you use the player for the first time, or if you have not used the player for a long time, recharge it fully (to the remaining battery indication of the display).

On the remaining battery indication

The battery icon in the display changes as shown below. See @ page 121 on battery duration.

The battery power gets low as shown in the battery icon. If "LOW BATTERY. Please Charge." appears, you cannot use the player. In this case, charge the battery by connecting to your computer.

Notes

- Charge the battery in an ambient temperature of between 5 to 35 °C (41 to 95 °F).
- The number of times the battery can be recharged before it is used up is approximately 500 times. This number may vary, depending on the conditions under which you use the player.
- The battery indicator on the display is only an estimate. For example, one section of black in the indicator will not always indicate exactly one-fourth of the battery's charge.
- "Do not disconnect." appears in the display while the player accesses the computer. Do not disconnect the supplied USB cable while "Do not disconnect." appears or the data being transferred may be damaged.
- The control buttons on the player are all disabled while it is connected to a computer.
- Some USB devices connected to the computer may interfere with the proper operation of the player.
- We do not guarantee the recharge of the battery using personally assembled computers or modified computers.

Maximizing Battery Life

By adjusting the settings or managing the power supply properly, it is possible to save the battery power and use the player for a longer time.

Turn off the player manually

If you press and hold the OPTION/PWR OFF button, the player enters the standby mode and the screen turns off to save battery power. Furthermore, if the standby mode continues for more than about a day, the player turns completely off automatically.

You can save battery power by setting as follows.

Note when connected to your computer

If the computer enters a power saving mode, such as the sleep or hibernation mode, while the player is connected via the USB cable, the player's battery is not charged. Instead, the player continues to draw power from the battery, discharging it.

Adjust data format and bit rate

Playing time will vary, as battery charge can be affected by the format and bit rate of songs, videos or photos that are played. For details on charging time and usage time, see **F** page 120, 121.

Note

• Do not leave the player connected for extended periods to a laptop computer that is not connected to AC power, because the player may discharge the computer's battery.

About Data Transferring

You can directly transfer data by dragging and dropping using Windows Explorer on your computer.

Playable data hierarchy has rules. Transfer data properly, see the following illustrations.

For details about dragging and dropping, refer to "Quick Start Guide."



- Some computers that already have Windows Media Player 10 installed may encounter file limitation (AAC, video files, etc.) that can be transferred by dragging and dropping. If you install Windows Media Player 11 (for details, see "Installing the Operation Guide and software" of "Quick Start Guide") from the supplied CD-ROM, you can solve this problem, then you can transfer by dragging and dropping again. Before installing Windows Media Player 11 on your computer, make sure to check whether your software or service corresponds to Windows Media Player 11.
- Data hierarchy may differ, depending on your computer environment.

For songs

(On Windows Explorer)

Drag and drop files or folders into the "MUSIC" folder. However, beyond the 8th level, neither files nor folders will be recognized.



(On the player)


Folders are displayed in the folder name order first, then files are displayed in the file name order. In this case, the upper or lower case letters are not distinguished.



For videos

(On Windows Explorer)

Drag and drop files or folders into the "VIDEO" folder. On the 1st level, the "VIDEO" folder will recognize either a file or a folder. Files on the 2nd level will be recognized. However, folders beyond the 2nd level and files beyond 3rd level will not be recognized.



* The "MP_ROOT" folder is used only when the player connects using certain dedicated software, or device. When you transfer data by dragging and dropping, use the "VIDEO" folder.

(On the player)

Video files are displayed in the order they are transferred by dragging and dropping. (The latest data is at the top.)


• You can set JPEG files as a thumbnails of video files, by placing JPEG files in the corresponding video folders. When you display the video list, you can see the thumbnails (small pictures to display on the menu) for the video files on the player. To display a thumbnail for a video file, create a JPEG file (horizontal 160 × vertical 120 dots, extension: .jpg) and name it the same as the desired video file, then store it in the video file folder.

For photos

(On Windows Explorer)

Drag and drop files or folders into the "PICTURE" or "DCIM" folder.

On the 1st level, the "PICTURE" folder will recognize either a file or a folder. The "DCIM" folder will only recognize a folder. Only files on the 2nd level will be recognized by both "DCIM" and "PICTURE" folders. However, beyond the 2nd level, neither files nor folders will be recognized.



* Data hierarchy of "PICTURES" is the same as the "PICTURE" folder.

(On the player)

Folders under the "PICTURE" and "DCIM" folders are displayed in alphabetical order. Files in the 1st level of the "PICTURE" folder are stored in the <PICTURE> folder.



Notes

- Do not disconnect the USB cable while "Do not disconnect." appears on the player or the data being transferred may be damaged.
- You cannot change folder names or delete the "MUSIC," "MP_ROOT," "VIDEO," "PICTURES," "PICTURE" and "DCIM" folders.
- Do not change folder or file names directly under the "MP_ROOT" folder. Otherwise, they will not be displayed on the player.

What are Format and Bit Rate?

What is audio format?

Audio format refers to the method used when importing audio data from the Internet or audio CDs to a computer and saving it as an audio file. Common formats include MP3 and WMA, etc.

MP3: MP3 (MPEG-1 Audio Layer3) is a common audio compression technology developed by the MPEG working group of the ISO (International Organization for Standardization).

MP3 can compress audio files to about 1/10 the size of standard CD audio files.

WMA: WMA (Windows Media Audio) is a common audio compression technology developed by Microsoft Corporation. The WMA format produces the same sound quality as that of the MP3 format with smaller file size.

AAC: AAC (Advanced Audio Coding) is a common audio compression technology developed by the MPEG working group of the ISO (International Organization for Standardization). The AAC format produces the same sound quality as that of the MP3 format, with a smaller file size.

Linear PCM: Linear PCM is an audio recording format without digital compression. You can listen to the sound with the same quality as CD music by recording with this format.

What is bit rate?

Bit rate refers to the amount of data used to store each second of audio. Generally, higher bit rates provide better sound quality, but require more storage space for the same length of audio.

What is the relationship between bit rate, sound quality, and storage size?

Generally, higher bit rates provide better sound quality, but require more storage space for the same length of audio, so you can store fewer songs on the player. Lower bit rates enable you to store more songs, but at a lower sound quality.

Note

• If you import a song from a CD to your computer at a low bit rate, you cannot improve the song's sound quality by selecting a high bit rate when transferring the song from the computer to the player.

What is video format?

Video format refers to the method used when importing video and audio data to a computer and saving it as a video file. Common formats include MPEG-4 and AVC, etc.

MPEG-4: MPEG-4 refers to Moving Picture Experts Group phase 4, developed by the MPEG working group of the ISO (International Organization for Standardization). The compression format is for video and audio data.

AVC: AVC refers to Advanced Video Coding, developed by the MPEG working group of the ISO (International Organization for Standardization). It enables production of more vivid images at a lower bit rate. AVC files include four profiles, and "AVC Baseline Profile" is one of them. AVC format is based on the MPEG-4 AVC standard of the ISO (International Organization for Standardization), and since AVC is standardized as the MPEG-4 Part 10 Advanced Video Coding, it is commonly referred to as MPEG-4 AVC/H.264 or H.264/AVC.

What is photo format?

Photo format refers to the method used when importing images to a computer and saving them as image files.

Common formats include JPEG, etc.

JPEG: JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) is a common image compression format developed by the JPEG. JPEG can compress an image file to about 1/10 to 1/100 the size of standard image files.

Storing Data

You can store computer data into the built-in flash memory of the player by transferring the data from your computer using Windows Explorer, or another transfer capable software. If the player is connected to the computer, the built-in flash memory appears in Windows Explorer as [WALKMAN.]

Notes

- Do not disconnect the supplied USB cable while transferring data between a computer and the player because the data being transferred could be damaged.
- Do not format the built-in flash memory using Windows Explorer. If you format the built-in flash memory, format it on the player (@ page 79).

Upgrading the Player's Firmware

You can update the player's firmware, ensuring you to add new features for the player by installing the latest player's firmware to the player. For details about the latest firmware information and how to install it, visit the following web site:
